Neill Stansbury is Co-founder and Director of GIACC. He is a construction lawyer who has worked for over 25 years in the international infrastructure sector. He is a Member of the World Federation of Engineering Organisation's Anti-corruption Standing Committee, and Chairman of British Standards Institute anti-bribery working group. He was co-founder and Co-ordinator (until 2010) of the UK Anti-Corruption Forum. He was founder and leader (until 2008) of Transparency International (UK)'s anti-corruption initiative in the international construction and engineering industry. Since 2003, he has been developing and promoting anti-corruption measures for the construction sector. He is co-author of various anti-corruption tools including the GIACC Resource Centre, Project Anti-Corruption System (PACS), Anti-Corruption Training Manual, and Anti-Corruption Code. He has given anti-corruption presentations and workshops in over 25 countries. He received an award as one of the "Top 25 Newsmakers for 2007" from the "Engineering News-Record" for his work in preventing corruption in the international construction industry. He received an award in 2008 as "International Fellow of the Year" from the Zimbabwe Institution of Engineers for his anti-corruption work. In 2010, he received, on account of his anti-corruption work, a Presidential Invitation to become a Fellow of the UK Institution of Civil Engineers.
